### Dear Sunflower Mission family,

During the last two years, the pandemic presented humankind with unprecedented challenges, personal loss, and ongoing difficulties. However, through this pandemic, we have witnessed and experienced courage, sacrifice, dedication, and resilience that made us stronger!

Fueled by a shared passion for education, your unwavering support, and our volunteers' commitment, Sunflower Mission was able to continue our work, undisrupted, in the face of economic hardships and lockdowns in the U.S. and Vietnam.

In 2021, instead of building new classrooms, we focused on repairing classrooms in Phu Yen, Bac Lieu, and Kien Giang to ensure that our students continue to have a safe haven to learn. A total of 1,200 K-12 scholarships and 184 college scholarships were awarded. During this time we continued English Initiative (EI), our video conference-based service program. EI actually became the week's highlight for many students during the lockdown when communication with the outside world was limited.

For the first time in the history of Sunflower Mission (SM), SEEDS (Students Expanding Education by Donating Services) and our team leaders in Vietnam, along with some of SM's top students, collaborated to organize and lead a major virtual fundraiser event that brought in over \$260,000!

As SM begins our third decade of operation, we continue to engage and prepare the next generation, our SEEDS leaders, in every aspect of our operations and entrust them with increasing responsibilities.

Developing future leaders is key to fulfilling our 100-year operation plan. SEEDS leaders are managing the English Initiative program and organizing major events. Their leadership and compassion extend beyond the classroom when they guided Kha Doan, a recipient of our most prestigious LSMSE scholarship, on his move to the U.S. to pursue a Ph.D. during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic. Indeed, the future looks bright for SM!

The year 2022 marks SM's 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary! As Vietnam and the needs of our students change, we strive to innovate programs to better educate our students both academically and socially.

Our mission would not be sustainable over the last 19 years without your support and commitment. Thank you for partnering with us on this mission to transform lives. We look forward to another 20 years of bringing hope and making dreams come true!



### Motorola Solutions Foundation

In 2021, as our world grappled with yet another challenging year, Sunflower Mission emerged bolstered by a new partnership and financial support from the Motorola Solutions Foundation, the charitable arm of Motorola Solutions.

# SCHOOL BUILDING REPORT

When Sunflower Mission was founded in October 2002, there was an urgent lack of access to education in rural areas. Our initial focus was to build as many 2-3 classroom schools as quickly as possible. The first was built in 2003, followed by a rapid wave of construction: at up to 8 schools per year.

Two decades later, Vietnam's infrastructure has greatly improved, and its educational needs have evolved. In recent years, we have focused on constructing modern elementary schools with computer rooms, libraries, and playgrounds.

However, the COVID-19 pandemic significantly impacted our building efforts. In late 2020, we pivoted to inspection and upkeep of existing schools, especially those built before 2015. Out of the 28 schools marked as needing repair, 6 have been fully restored and the rest remain ongoing.

In December 2021, we reached an agreement with the people of Da Krong district, in Quang Tri province, to construct A Ngo, a model school with 6 classrooms and all-new amenities — serving 125 local students who have no nearby school. At the time of this report, construction is in full swing.

Amid travel restrictions caused by the pandemic, Sunflower Mission was able to continue this important work thanks to the dedication of incountry volunteers and construction teams. We owe our utmost gratitude to those leading inspections of existing schools, scouting new locations, and working with the local government to finalize projects.

### SEEDS: THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT

As we look forward to celebrating Sunflower Mission's 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we also mark the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the formation of SEEDS (Students Expanding Education by Donating Services).

This group of passionate school-age supporters came together in 2007 to support the work of SM. SEEDS have been an instrumental conduit between the broader SM family and youth around the world.

We asked a few SEEDS leaders to reflect on the evolution of the group since its founding in 2007. One striking similarity among all SEEDS members is their maturity.

The motivation for many SEEDS leaders comes from their interaction with local residents in the Vietnam villages in which they visited.

Like many fellow SEEDS members, Kody Ngo 's most cherished and memorable moments are the times they spend with each other applying fresh paint on the newly built classroom in the humid summers of Vietnam or organizing fundraiser events.

After returning from a Vietnam work camp trip and observing the conditions of students there; Don Quy-Le Dao says: "[our purpose was to give our] time, money, and spirit to empower education and raise communities out of poverty."

SEEDS's fresh ideas and unique perspectives have been invaluable to Sunflower Mission as they help to evolve the services we offer to ensure we provide relevant skills. English Initiative (EI) is a SEEDS managed program that helps students in Vietnam improve their English conversational and written skills. Dalton Bui and Jacqueline Hoang have led a group of English-fluent volunteers and connected them, virtually, with Sunflower Mission scholarship recipients in Vietnam who are looking to strengthen their English language skills. This cultural and educational bridge between East and West is a valued connection.

The friendship, camaraderie, and personal fulfillment are immeasurable and indescribable. With encouragement, trust, and guidance from Sunflower Mission's Board of Directors, SEEDS have not only contributed to Sunflower Mission's past and present success, they are also our future! This is a dream come true for the Sunflower Mission family.

I've cherished this heartwarming moment since then, and it's inspired me to continue working with SM through the years."






